
Computers & internet:

It's always peaceful in the library so it's the perfect place for study and reflection.



By Daniel Bernstein



Contains 200 USMLE – style clinical vignette questions and is divided into two sections. Section one focuses on general practice of paediatrics. Section two focuses on a systematic approach to developing a differential diagnosis.

Literature Searching:


We offer a full literature searching service. We can search for a single piece of information or undertake a detailed literature search.

Edited by Greg McLatchie, et al (WO 39)



By Mindy A Smith (WB 105)


